

The Haven Assisted Living Residency Standards

Residents must meet and maintain these standards to reside at The Haven

- Be able to maintain social continence (incontinence managed or contained with products). Continence care may be provided through expanded services and fees assessed accordingly. Persons must not be consistently, uncontrollably incontinent. Bedside commodes and/or bedpans are not allowed, except in cases where Hospice staff is caring for an individual.
- Be willing and able to meet acceptable personal hygiene as determined by The Haven staff, doctors, and family members. Assistance from staff is acceptable.
- Be willing to have a second opinion if there is reason to believe that a communicable disease or infectious condition exists which may endanger other residents or staff.
- Be free from any active alcohol and/or substance abuse that may not be manageable at The Haven.
- Be mobile and able to transfer and function independently. There are circumstances when Haven staff will lift residents pursuant to policy; and times when there is limited, minimal stand by and mobility assistance, as outlined in expanded services. The Haven does not accept bedridden individuals.
- The Haven does accept persons with memory and/or cognitive impairments. Care is provided through expanded services. Cognitive function must not be impaired as to cause a danger to self, staff or others. The Haven is NOT a secured facility. Those persons at risk of wandering from the facility will not be accepted. Individuals who reside at the Haven and as a result of increased cognition impairment present a risk of wandering will be transitioned to an appropriate setting.
- Be able and willing to maintain a behavior that is not destructive, aggressive, intimidating, or violent toward self or others.
- Be free from a history of psychiatric problems which may not be manageable at The Haven.
- Be free from intravenous therapy, nursing, and/or skilled care beyond which the staff of The Haven is trained. VNA or other outside agencies may provide services. The Haven staff does nothing invasive to the body.
- Be free from the need for restraints (as defined by the State)
- Be willing and able to take meals in the dining room. Meals may be taken to the resident's room only
 on the most temporary of occasions.
